Quick Tech Idea, Jim Cooper Awning Bar Clamp, Designed by Lee Cantrell

Listen up if you have a Zip Dee awning. We live in fear of the awning opening up at 60 MPH after we forgot to lock it down. I know, you've never forgotten, but I saw someone who did. Many of us wrap a length of Velcro tape around the bars as an extra safety measure.

Lee made an aluminum clamp that would prevent the bars from opening, and thus the awning from swinging out from the trailer. He used $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide by $\frac{1}{8}$ inch thick aluminum from the hardware store. The parts were bent using a vise and hammer. The piece with the screw is threaded so that the screw can't be lost.

If you are clever, you might figure how to lengthen one hole, notch the other, and use a longer screw; then, it would all stay together when removed -- no lost parts.
