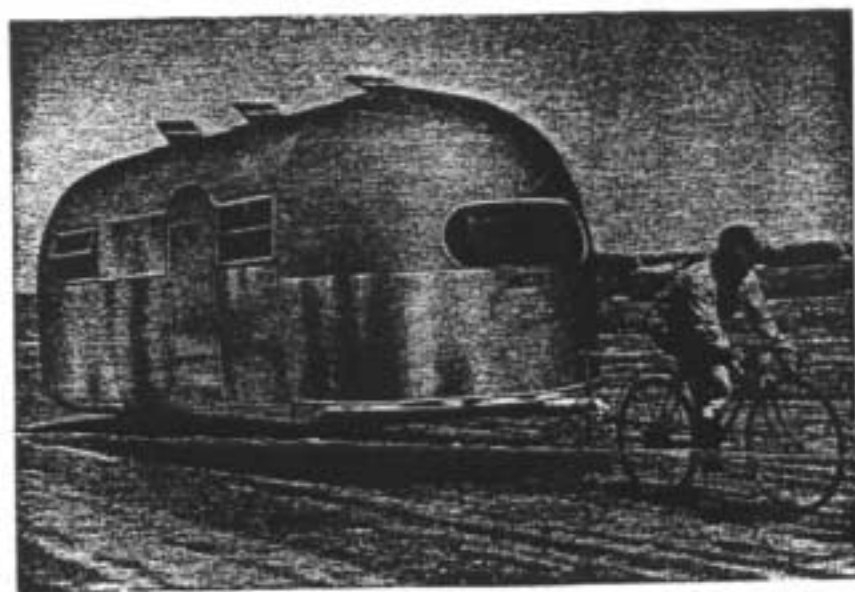

# "ALFRED" DID IT! . . . . .

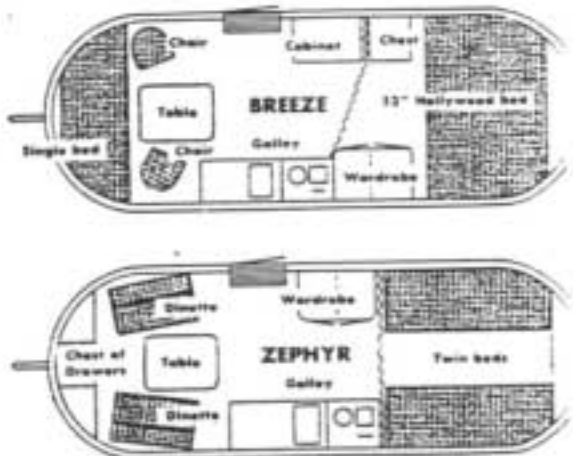
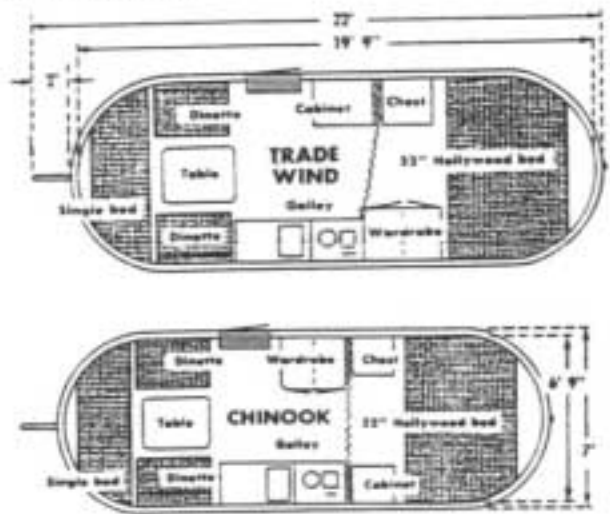


## WITH HIS BICYCLE

Alfred LeTourneur, who holds the world's bicycle speed record of 108.6 miles per hour, actually towed the 22 ft. model "Airstream Liner" on his racing bicycle at the Metropolitan Airport, Van Nuys, California.

The trade name "Airstream" pertains to air—airflow—streamlining; therefore, we have named our various models after popular winds, namely: Breeze—Chinook—Southwind—Tradewind—Westwind—Zephyr and the 28 ft. "Superliner," Westwind. The new 16 ft. model is named the Wee Wind. (Just a little wind)

SIX floor plans available; all priced the same, (20 ft. models) and include three overhead roof lockers which are not shown in diagrams.



The other floor plans not shown here, are the combination of a Zephyr front end and the Trade-Wind rear and cabinets to make the West Wind. The front end of the Zec and the rear end of the Chinook combines to make South Wind.

"Airstream Liners" are insulated with 1 1/2" of plasticized spun glass packed between the walls. The double floor has "I" beams and is also insulated with plasticized spun glass, thus insuring ample protection from the weather both in winter and summer. Weights: 16 ft. model, under 1200 lbs. furnished; 22 ft. model, approximately 1700 lbs. furnished; 28 ft. "Superliner," under 2800 lbs. furnished. Clear vision through trailer from your car rear sight mirror. This is a dandy feature and a safety factor.
